LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading - Wisdom 3:1-9
Read by Janine

The souls of the virtuous are in the hands of God, no torment shall ever touch them. In the eyes of the unwise, they did appear to die, their going looked like a disaster, their leaving us like the end; but they are in peace. If they experienced suffering as we see it, their hope is rich with immortality; slight was their affliction compared with how great their blessings will be. God has put them to the test and proved them worthy. They have been tested like gold in a furnace, and accepted as a sacrifice. When the time comes for God to visit, they will shine out; as sparks run through the stubble, so will they. They shall judge nations, rule over peoples, and the Lord will be their king forever. COMMITTAL

(The coffin is now lowered)

Fr Krupa: But the Lord Jesus Christ will change our mortal bodies and make them like his own, in glory, for he is risen, the firstborn from the dead. So, let us commend our sister Marlie to the Lord, that God may embrace her in peace and raise up her body on the last day. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

INTERCESSIONS

Fr Krupa: For our sister Marlie, let us pray to our Lord Jesus Christ, who said "I am the Resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me shall live even in death and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die. Lord you consoled Martha & Mary in their distress; draw near to us who mourn for Marlie and dry the tears of those who weep. We pray to the Lord

All: Lord have mercy.

Fr Krupa: You wept at the grave of Lazarus, your friend; comfort us in our sorrow. We pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Fr Krupa: You raised the dead to life; give to our sister Marlie eternal life. We pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Fr Krupa: Our sister Marlie, was washed in baptism and anointed with the Holy Spirit, give her fellowship with all your saints. We pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Fr Krupa: She was nourished with your body and blood; grant her a place at the table in your heavenly kingdom. We pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

Fr Krupa: Comfort us in our sorrow at the death of our sister Marlie; let our faith be our consolation and eternal life our hope. We pray to the Lord.

All: Lord have mercy.

CONCLUDING RITE

Fr Krupa: With longing for God's kingdom, let us pray:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation. But deliver us from evil. Amen.

Fr Krupa: God of holiness and power, accept our prayers on behalf of your servant, Angeletta Maria Parer; do not count her deeds against her for in her heart she always desired to do your will. As her faith united her to your people on earth, so may your mercy join her to the saints in heaven. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Fr Krupa: Into Your hands, Father of mercies, we commend our sister Angeletta Maria Parer, in the sure and certain hope that, together with all who have died in Christ, she will rise with Christ on the last day. We thank you for all the blessings which you bestowed on Marlie in this life: they are signs to us of your goodness and of our fellowship with the saints in Christ. Merciful Lord, turn toward us and listen to our prayers: open the gates of paradise to your servant, and help us who remain to comfort one another until we all meet in Christ and are with you and our sister Marlie forever. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Fr Krupa: In peace, let us take Marlie's body to its place of rest.

All Say: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His Holy Church.

PRAYER OVER THE GIFTS

Fr Krupa: Lord, receive the gifts we offer for the eternal peace of Marlie. May Christ be merciful in judging him for she has believed in Christ as his Lord and Saviour. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

All Say: Amen.

PREFACE

Fr Krupa: The Lord be with you.

All Say: And with your spirit.

Fr Krupa: Lift up your hearts.

All Say: We lift them up to the Lord.

Fr Krupa: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All Say: It is right and just.

Fr Krupa: It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, Holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Christ our Lord. In him the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, that those saddened by the certainty of dying might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed, for your faithful, Lord, life is changed, not ended and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven. And so, with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions, and with all the hosts and powers of heaven,

we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim:

All say: Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the Highest.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

Fr Krupa: Lord, you are holy indeed, the fountain of all holiness. Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. At the time, he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take this all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you."

Fr Krupa: In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice and, once more giving thanks, he gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins". "Do this in memory of me".

Fr Krupa: The mystery of faith!

All Sing: When we eat this bread and drink this cup
We proclaim your death, O Lord, until you come again.

Fr Krupa: Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection, we offer you, Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of salvation, giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you. Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit. Remember, Lord, your Church spread throughout the world, and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Leo 14th our Pope, Mark our Archbishop and all the clergy.

Remember your servant, Angeletta Maria Parer, whom you have called from this world to yourself. Grant that she who was united with your Son in a death like his, may also be one with him in his Resurrection. Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light of your face. Have mercy on us all, we pray, that, with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with Joseph her spouse, with the blessed Apostles, and all the Saints who have pleased you throughout the ages, we may merit to be coheirs to eternal life, and may praise and glorify you through your Son, Jesus Christ.

Fr Krupa: Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

All Sing: Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Fr Krupa: Let us pray for the coming of the kingdom as Jesus taught us.

All Say: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

Fr Krupa: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

All Say: For the kingdom, the power and the glory are Yours, now and forever. Amen.
